




Role of CoOperative Organisations in Developing Tribal Economy

Tribals are among the most downtrodden section of the society who have been victims of age-old social and cultural prejudices and hostile environmental factors. Their integration with the mainstream of national life has been recognised as a necessary condition for their welfare. In this context, co-operatives have been recognised as a notable institutional framework for the development of hill and tribal areas. As an ideal institutional structure, co-operative organisations have helped in upgrading the economic status and the quality of life of the tribals as they can bring these vulnerable sections within a common fold, supplement their meager resources by providing concessional credit and workout a scheme for their economic betterment with adequate financial support from the Government. A serious attempt has been made in this book to explore the structure of co-operatives in the predominantly tribal areas of Tamil Nadu and to assess of their role in toning up the tribal economy in an empirical manner.
