

## CITY LIGHTS AND STREETS AHEAD: Memoirs of Keith Waterhouse

He recalls his childhood and adolescence in soot-blackened, tramcar-rattling Leeds, and describes with his customary wit, warmth and eye for detail the earliest events that shaped him as a writer. Streets Ahead takes up where City Lights left off: Waterhouse arrives in Fleet Street in the days of long liquid lunches, of eccentric and inspired newspapermen and of foreign assignments. British New Wave writing was taking off with works such as his Billy Liar. Waterhouse tells of his Hollywood days, his departure from the Daily Mirror, the decline of Fleet Street and his adventures as a solo playwright. Streets Ahead is a lyrical and very funny memoir of an eventful, euphoric era.
