Science must come to recognize the fact that spirit is supreme over matter, rather than dependent on matter for existence. I believe that the student must look at the facts of the universe from the position of Jesus, if he is to gain the proper perspective. Thus may he hope to find the harmony of the universe. In Him all things consist, and the view which leaves Jesus Christ out of the universe, or makes Him anything...
