The Bhopal gas tragedy of 1984 was the worst-ever such accident in the History of process industries. India, thus has the dubious distinction of setting two World records in the realm of industrial accidents within a span of 13 years. Indeed, during the last two decades India has witnessed thousands of industrial accidents involving tires, explosions, toxic releases or combinations of these. The experience of the rest of the developing world is similar - with increasing population, industrialization, and number of hazardous chemicals/process, the frequency as well as severity of industrial accidents is increasing.
