




Analysis of Civic Action in Selected Underdeveloped Countries

Military policy contributes to foreign policy in these countries through the activities of Military Assistance Advisory Groups (MAAGs) and Military Missions. These U. S. advisory personnel are able to support both the welfare and independence of underdeveloped countries through the concept of civic action. Civic action involves the use of military forces on projects that will raise the socioeconomic standards in underdeveloped countries. Suitable projects are improvements in the fields of education, training, public works, agriculture, communications, health, sanitation, and public administration. The purpose of civic action is two fold: first, it is intended to raise the standard of living; second, it is intended to improve the relationship between the participating military forces and the indigenous population. Ideally, the participation of U. S. military personnel in civic action in underdeveloped countries is limited to advice and assistance. These MAAGs and Missions, augmented as necessary, sponsor civic action projects in coordination with the Ambassador and other members...
