All Roads Lead to Calvary is a 1919 novel by the British writer Jerome K. Jerome. It was one of the last works written by Jerome, better known for his *Three Men in a Boat*, and shows the influence of the First World War on him. It is a Bildungsroman in which a Cambridge University educated woman Joan Allway becomes a journalist and then a wartime ambulance driver. She encounters various different people, gaining new experiences and confronting many of the moral issues of the day. In 1921 the film was turned into a silent British film *All Roads Lead to Calvary* directed by Kenelm Foss. Jerome Klapka Jerome (2 May 1859 14 June 1927) was an English writer and humourist, best known for the comic travelogue *Three Men in a Boat* (1887). Other works include the essay collections *Idle Thoughts of an Idle Fellow* (1886) and *Second Thoughts of an Idle Fellow*; *Three Men on the Bummel*, a sequel to *Three Men in a Boat* (Packing for the journey); and several other novels. Jerome was born in Caldmore, Walsall,...
